8. PUBLIC HEARINGS

a. AN-4-22 Haywood Glen

Public hearing opened at 7:16 p.m.

Development Services Director Jason Brown presented a voluntary petition for the annexation of 36.30 acres located at 2016 Horton Road for a proposed mixeduse development featuring 103 single-family lots and a 1.5-acre commercial outparcel.

Mr. Brown shared a cost-benefit analysis, highlighting projected revenues and expenditures, noted projected demographics, and indicated the future commercial portion of the development is not included in the analysis as it is undefined at this time.

b. AN-5-22 Allen Park

Public hearing opened at 7:20 p.m.

Development Services Director Jason Brown presented a voluntary petition for annexation of 177 acres located at 2300 Old Milburnie Road. The property is proposed to be developed as a mixed-density neighborhood featuring 624 singlefamily and townhome lots and a future 4.42-acre commercial outparcel.

Mr. Brown shared a cost-benefit analysis, highlighting projected revenues and expenditures, discussed projected demographics, and noted the future commercial portion is not included in the analysis as it remains undefined at this time.

Councilor McDonald commented on the importance of monitoring police staffing needs as the town receives more annexation requests.

Beth Trahos, 4140 Parklake Avenue, Raleigh, NC spoke on behalf of the applicant and in favor of AN-5-22, sharing that she was available to answer questions.

c. Allen Park Utility Allocation Agreement

Development Services Director Jason Brown presented a Utility Allocation Agreement (UAA) for consideration for Allen Park, a development that was approved in April 2021 for 624 single-family lots.

Mr. Brown summarized the project profile, surrounding area land uses, master plan, and project timeline.

Mr. Brown provided an overview of the UAA, highlighting public utilities, water allocation policy compliance, phasing, off-site transportation improvements, and zoning conditions.

Mr. Brown indicated that staff is still working with the developer to finalize the terms of the UAA and are waiting for a transportation memo, therefore staff recommends continuing the case until the next Regular Town Council meeting.

Town Manager Bill Summers highlighted Operation Green Light, a nationwide initiative to acknowledge the challenges faced by veterans as they transition back into civilian life.

The proposed resolution supports Operation Green Light's efforts and encourages residents and businesses in the community to shine a green light from November 7, 2022 to November 14, 2022 as a way to show support for local veterans.

The Veterans Memorial Advisory Board voted unanimously to recommend adoption of the resolution.

Mr. Summers answered questions from Council about where to purchase green lightbulbs and how the town will promote the initiative.

Mr. Brown noted the project bids came back higher than originally budgeted, therefore staff is requesting additional funding to complete the project.

Mayor Pro Tem Morgan thanked staff and expressed the Council's desire and commitment to the project.
